Successful Meetings of Federation of SBI Pensioner's Associations

The Governing and General Body Meetings were held at Lucknow on 30th and 31st July, 2022 in a grand manner. The physical meeting of Governing Body as well as 36th Annual General Meeting were held after lengthy gap of one year six months (approximately) due to the impact of Covid which prevented group meetings by the union of India and all states even now also with reider to observe all Covid norms. Though there are good number of Covid cases across the county. However after taking all precautions both the meetings were organised by the team of Lucknow Circle under the leadership of Sri Dinesh Chandra, General Secretary. The entire leadership of the Federation representing the affiliates participated in the meetings and contributed for the grand success of both the meetings.

The delegates who had come from all parts of the county, participated in the deliberations and took up several issues for discussions at length. The meetings also had an occasion to deliberate on the various developments both at industry as well as bank level with particular reference to the

ongoing 10th and 11th bipartite negotiations and also the issues concerning retirees in the Banking industry.

The Federation also had an occasion to deliberate on the status of the court case filed to resolve the issue of 50% of the last drawn pay as pension to all our retirees.

Our Association was represented by Sri T. Ramesh Rao, President, Sri M.G. Venkatesha Murthy, Vice President, Sri W.R. Subhash Kuyumar, Jt. General Secretary and Sri S.P. Rao, Asst. Treasurer. The participants appreciated all the arrangements made by the Lucknow Circle Association.

The two day meeting concluded with the conduct of elections. Members have lot of expectations on newly elected committee of the Federation. The most important and burning issue before the federation apart from other issues, is updation of pension. Let us do everything possible achieve the goal.



EXTRACT OF THE REPORT OF GENERAL SECRETARY TO THE GOVERNING BODY ON 30TH AND 37TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING ON THE 31ST JULY 2022 AT LUCKNOW

1. COURT CASE AT DELHI HIGH COURT- PRESENT POSITION

The Federation case at Delhi High Court did not make in progress from the month of December 2019 due to dreadful pandemic COVID-19. In the meantime. The case was last heard on 27 May 2019 in the Hon'ble Court of C wherein the Hon'ble Ci made serious observations and expressed that the matter will be heard expeditiously at an earlier date and disposed of particularly in view of certain orders passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court directing expeditious hearing and disposal of the matter within a particular time frame. The observations were not taken in letter and spirit by the successive Hon'ble benches till the month of December and thereafter dreadful disease COVID played major role for one and half year where no hearing was there though the dates were fixed and postponed time and again by Registrar General. We made application on 28 October 2021 for early hearing and it came up for hearing on 12 November 21 but were deferred by the Hon'ble High Court stating the prevalence of pandemic across the Country and more so in the city of Delhi. Hearing of the case through virtual mode as its own difficulties in presenting the case. The Hon'ble bench made the following observations while suggested the council to apply for early hearing in the month of February 2022. The Hon'ble court said that they are working in a truncated mode, at present this application cannot be entertained. Leave is ,however granted to the applicants /petitioners, to move the court for fixing the date in the matter in February 22. There is no way for the Federation to take the case forward except to wait up to the month of February. In the meantime, adverse comments in social media made the leadership at all levels feel bad about the situation. There was a pressure from all corners to change the senior council as his performance is not

at the expected levels. The Core committee which met on 31st October 21 took a decision to change the senior council as he is not in a position to take the case forward. We requested our AOR to furnish a few names of senior advocates of good standing in Delhi HC to be a senior council though the other advocate Mr. Debesh Panda is quite competent to handle our case but presence of a senior council is a must as per the court norms/practice.

In the past we made earnest attempt by filing Special Leave Petition and Transfer Petition to Hon'ble Supreme Court but both were dismissed siting that the adjournments of short duration are common. The Supreme Court Order to DHC in the year 2013 to complete hearing of the case in six months has no impact and the reminder 2017 to DHC has not created any impact on the Hon'ble bench of DHC. The observation of Chief Justice of Hon'ble DHC siting the reasons of non-closure of our case in his bench did not provide any solution to our case except long adjournments. Onset of COVID had a fatal blow resulting in non- hearing of the case for one and half year approximately. Now the cases are taken up for hearing on selective basis again pushing our case to the backseat. We appeal to the members of this august body not to carried away on what is appearing in social media and other source of news intended to demoralize the leadership of the Federation and its affiliates. The case stands posted to 29th August 2022

2. ZOOM MEETINGS

At the request made by all the affiliates to know what is happening at the Corporate Center/ Federation/Court case every month Zoon meetings were held to exchange/share the information from the affiliates/Federation. These meetings have created better understanding of matters in all fronts. The

meetings were held once a month from the month of August without fail. We have created a platform for our self to express the important issues. Now most of the affiliates got acquainted with the procedure of joining the meeting and speak what they want to represent. The last zoom meeting was conducted on 30th June 2022. On 12th July a similar meeting was held to brief the proceedings of meeting on 8th with CC officials on upcoming insurance policy (A&B) 2022-23.

3. CORPORATE STRUCTURED MEETING WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF FEDERATION

The concept of holding structured meeting with the Circle and Federation began from the year 2010 and they were conducted with all the sincerity. The meetings could not be held from the month of December 2019 till date either virtual mode or physically as the instructions from Union of India has prohibited on the ground gathering of any nature will be the cause for spread of this pandemic diseases. The ban on such type of meetings is still in vogue. The senior citizens are confined to home or to a limited movement in the surroundings of their house/flat. In this odd condition the supply of medicines did not stop and they are allowed to purchase medicines from a near by pharmacy and seek reimbursement from their pension paying branch. This facility was in vogue up to 31st December 2021.

The Corporate Structured Meeting was held at Hyderabad on 10th of December 21 under the Chairmanship of the Deputy Managing Director & CDO Shri O.P. Mishra. Shri Lam, GM, Shri Arun Kumar Sahu, DGM, Sandipta Kumar Naik, AGM all from PPG Department participated in the meeting. From the Federation S/s G.K. Gandhi, President, A.Ramesh Babu, GS and representatives from all affiliates

Participated. The proceedings were cordial. The details of the proceedings were circulated separately. Thereafter as directed by DMD we presented a detailed report on the items of agenda discussed in

the meeting and sought a small committee meeting or video conference to discuss the fate of the issues presented in the meeting. The bank for various reasons is not responding to the issues raised in the meeting but the Federation is reminding the CC continuously on the agenda discussed in the meeting. Now all the DGM grade officials got elevation to the next grade the entire PPG department has new set of officials adding to the delays.

4. MEETING WITH MINISTRY OFFICIALS OF DEPARTMENT PENSIONERS GRIEVANCES GOVT. OF INDIA IN VIRTUAL FORUM ON 24TH MAY 2022

Shri Ramesh Babu, our General Secretary was advised that Department of Pensions (Govt. of India) will hold Virtual Meeting at 4 P.M. on 24/05/2022 on the issues of the Grievances of SBI Pensioners. Meeting was being organized exclusively for SBI Pensioners where along with our Federation, the representatives of SBI as well as Officials of Department of Financial Services, Ministry of Finance were required to participate. This meeting was arranged by Dr. B. Yerram Raju, Ph.D. a Retired Official of SBI, and advisor as well as Founder Director of Telangana Industrial Health Clinic Ltd., He retired under 6th Bipartite Salary Structure. Sri G.K.Gandhi, President represented Federation as Shri Ramesh Babu could not attend due to health issues. Mr. Lama, General Manager, H.R. at Corporate Centre, was present as representatives of SBI, the Officials of DFS were also present.

Mr. Raju complained that he was now 81 years old and the pension received by him was paltry sum. The Secretary Pension Department Shri V. Shrinivas was surprised and enquired why it is so. The Officials of DFS explained that Pension is fixed on grade in which a person retired. There is no provision for upward revision in the system. A pensioner continues to draw same pension with periodically revised D.A

The Federation was then asked to present the case. The following points were raised after earlier

consultation with Ramesh Babu, S.B. Gokhale and D.K. Basu.

- i. The Murmu Committee Report was still not implemented to full extent and pensioners are yet denied pension on PQA & FPA. Further the Murmur Committee had recommended that 4250/- has to be converted to Rs.7120/-. The 8th Bipartite retirees were paid pension on pay scale of 8th Bipartite from 01.05.2005, that who retired between 01.11.2002 to 30.04.2005 were paid pension on old scale of Rs.4250/- whereas earlier 7th Bipartite Retirees were already paid, pension of Rs.7120/-. This anomaly should be removed.
- ii. D.A. Formula — In the old Scheme D.A. on Pension was paid on Structured basis. With 8th Bipartite Salary Structure, the System of 100% neutralization was introduced. Only 5th, 6th & 7th Bipartite Retirees are paid Structured D.A. Our submission was that when 100% neutralization has been accepted and introduced why deprive old Pensioners from this benefit? A small number of such retirees have survived, and it is not going to cost huge expenditure to the Bank.
- iii. Commutation factor in SBI: The SBI retirees suffer double loss. The factor which is available in other Banks at the age of 70 is offered to SBI Retirees at the age of 60. As it is all the official get 40% pension. They, therefore, suffer double loss. We emphasized that Ministry should issue directives to provide commutation as per Industry Level norms to SBI Retirees.

The Secretary Ministry of Pensions and Public Grievances then enquired about the issue of Updation of Pension Mr. Lama who represented SBI said that they are in correspondence with Govt. The Finance Ministry Official said that IBA has appointed a committee to look into this issue, their recommendation has been submitted to the Ministry. In the meantime, the matter has been taken to

Supreme Court, and as the issue now is sub-judice Ministry cannot help.

Dr. Raju suggested that the issue can be resolved if the parties involved can sit together and conclude. Supreme Court will be too happy if the parties come to a resolution and withdraw the case.

The Secretary finally said that as this issue is before Supreme Court, there was very little his department could do. He, however, observed that he was unable to understand why a Senior Official of Bank is getting such a small amount as pension.

The Meeting lasted for 40 minutes. We thanked the Secretary for his concern for SSBI Pensioners. Mr. Raju after the Meeting called me to convey his appreciation for powerful presentation on behalf of Federation. It was suggested to Shri Raju that he should, with his contacts arrange face to face meeting with Ministry Officials. He said he is going to Canada and will return in August. I told him that we will wait. I thanked him for his initiative taken in this regard.

5. APPROVAL FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEARS 2021-2022

The Financial Statements for the years 2021 -22 were placed in the folder for your perusal and approval The soft copies of the same were mailed to you with an intention that the needed discussion will take place in this meeting.

6. INSURANCE ISSUES, E-PHARMACY

The concept of E-Pharmacy has come in to effect in the month of June 2020 with a delay of six months. The concept is very much new to the pensioners especially those pensioners who have android facility in their mobile. I-phone also suffered in the same way. After thorough exercise the I-phone has also benefited with the facility of ordering medicines through the above application. The facility was not appreciated many of the senior pensioners and also many of the circles as the Apollo suffered with no outlets for delivery of the medicines. The

limited staff operating were not in a position to deliver all the medicines at a time. Our representatives in support with ARIBL held many meetings with Apollo Administrators. Apollo on one side needed enrolment of pensioners to boost up the registrations but that exercise did not throw wanted results. In this situation Federation was consulted on improvement of the scheme. The Federation suggested that proportionate subsidy with each purchase of medicines alone can improve the registration and the business of Apollo will flourish. Now the complaints are little less and pensioners are happy with the introduction of proportionate subsidy.

During the COVID period the hospitals are over crowded making our policy holders finding it difficult to get cash less treatment. One silver line in the dreadful situation is Bank including COVID treatment reimbursement for all segments including Staff Welfare Funds for retired employees.

In the post COVID situation the cost of operation and hospitalization got escalated particularly on 8 serious ailments. The ceilings fixed for these 8 ailments needs a revision to suit the hospital demand. The alternative is to identify hospitals in each AO area for the amount already fixed in the year 2020 by the bank.

The COVID situation and the cost of hospitalization shall be eye opener to those nonmembers who were not the members in any of the bank floated insurance schemes.

Presently the premium was kept at the same rate for the past 3 years with SBI General Insurance. In the event of the contract is likely to be terminated or renewed the premium may likely to go up by substantial amount. However, we understand from the CC that our Federation views will be taken in to consideration before finalizing the scheme for the 2023-24

MEETING WITH OFFICIALS OF CORPORATE CENTER ON INSURANCE

We have to advise that on 8th July 2022 the Federation representatives lead by MR Gandhi, President, A.Ramesh Babu, GS, D.K.Basu , Secretary , S.B. Gokhale SR Vice President and Chhabria R.V, GS, Mumbai Metro had initial discussion with the Corporate Officials S/s Lama, GM, Stony Ghosh, DGM-PM, Kishore Kunar Singh and Sandepta Kumar Nayak both AGMS on renewal of both the policies for the year 2023-24.

Salient features of discussion are

1. Posthospitalization charges be reimbursed @10% if recommended by the attending doctor
2. Net-work hospitals in districts be increased
3. At present the charges on identified ailments are not followed by hospitals. Therefore in order to benefit the insured hospitals for charging the amounts prescribed in the circulars be identified by the Insurance agency
4. Physiotherapy charges be reimbursed even if taken at the residence of the insured
5. Tariff on Room rent -it was the practice of the hospital to escalate all services as per room rent. E.g. Room rent Rs 5000/- eligible but the insured stays in Rs 7000/- as no room available at the above rate. The bill will be 30% more than the normal bill.

On 9th the Affiliates are advised the details of the meeting through VC conference.

URWORLD

1. Arrangements to make payment on line instead of payment of cash
2. All medicines are not supplied at one go. As there is no response from URWORLD the pensioners are left in lurch whether to purchase them separately or to wait for the supply of medicines.
3. URWORLD application shall made available to Policy A holders also



REPORT OF THE GENERAL SECRETARY OF SBI PENSIONERS' ASSOCIATION (K) ON BEHALF OF THE MANAGING COMMITTEE OF THE ASSOCIATION

It is my great pleasure to Wish all the Executive committee members and members of all the affiliates of Federation of SBSPA I also convey our good wishes and extend greetings to all the members of all other PENSIONERS ASSOCIATION MEMBERS OF STATE BANK OF INIDA .

We at our Association level also lost almost 208 of our members during the Pandemic. (till 31st march 2022) We were also unfortunate to loose our Honorable President Shri Shantaraju, our Gen Secretary Shri G.Sukumar and.Com K.K.Nair, chairman of UFBU(till 2019), Dr.Manohar and Dr Raju our panel doctors.

Due to the pandemic situation elections to the management committee members could not not held as scheduled during 2020. The same was held 9th may 2022 which was a combined general body meeting .The GB was attended by about 1200 members and their family members.

Elections for the formation of new MC members was also conducted. The Elections were held only for the post for President and Vice president (4post) Rest all the Members of the New Management committee namely General Secretary, Jt.Gen.Secretary, Treasurer, Asst.Treasurer, Secretaries (9posts), Committee members (8posts) were declared as elected unanimously. The names of the new office bearers is enclosed separately.

Due to the pandemic situation we were not in position to conduct regular monthly meetings after the last general body meeting held on 12th November 2019.Our Musings also could not be printed regularly. I am also happy to inform this august body that about 605 new members have joined our organization as on

31/03/2022. Issues of payment of arrears on account of Increase in family Pension and stagnation increment and fitments on account of the stagnation increment are being represented to our PPG dept on a case to case basis. However we have been told by our PPG dept that majority of our family pensioner were already drawing more than the ceiling amount hence are not eligible to the increase. As per the tradition of our association it is a great honour to felicitate our senior members who attain the age of 70/80/90 years. The last time it was done was during the last GB meeting held in Nov. 2019. Since then a no. of our senior members crossed that age as on 31/12/2020 and 31/12/2021.About 172 senior members have been honored. provided an opportunity to interact with the members in the interior parts and to hear the grievances to find solutions with the administrative office.We are happy to inform that the number of new members outside Bangalore has also increased. :Top priority is being given for issue of Pensioner ID card with the help of PPG dept and also settlement of Medical Bills with the Insurance authorities OAD dept. The amount of Death relief has also been increased from Rs.4000/- to Rs.5000/- as a token of relief to the family of the spouse of the pensioner after receiving the information of demise. Our unit has also donated Rs.25000/- to GERIZM Integrated Home and school for the Handicapped as a social obligation towards the Society.

RESOLUTIONS PASSED BY THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE DURING THE MEETING HELD ON 13/07/2022

- 1) Pension loan to be covered by Insurance.
Rationale: To reduce the hardship Of repayment of the balance amount if any by the Family.
- 2) Day Care treatment and Skin dieases to be included especially allergic diseas like Psoriasis, Herpes, LatexAllergy etc. and chemotrapy trreatment to be included for reimbursement in Medical Policy.
Rationale: All the above treatment are result of after effect of particular disease and are part of the original treatment.
- 3) Reimbursement of Service and Gst charges on Medical Insurance policies.
Rationale: To reduce the burden on Pensioners.
- 4) Inclusion of tests like, C-Peptide, MRI SCAN, CITISCAN, TMT etc. for yearly checkup prescriptions by Bank Doctors.
Rationale; All the above test are costly and pocket pinching to the pensioners.
- 5) Inclusion of PenInsulins also to be included to be supplied by Bank Dispensaries.
Rationale: Many of our Pensioners who have creossed the age of 70 are unable to self inject the regular insulin themselves.
- 6) Corporate centre should instruct Local Head Office of all the circles to conduct structural meetings every 6 months.
Rationale: To bring seriousness at the local level in solving the problems of Pensioners.
- 7) Observers to be permitted to accompany the delegates at the federation council and session officially by including a clause in the bye law of the Federation.
- 8) Inclusion of atleast one Lady delegate from all the circles to the Genral council.

Ratioanal: To give representation to Women pensioners also.

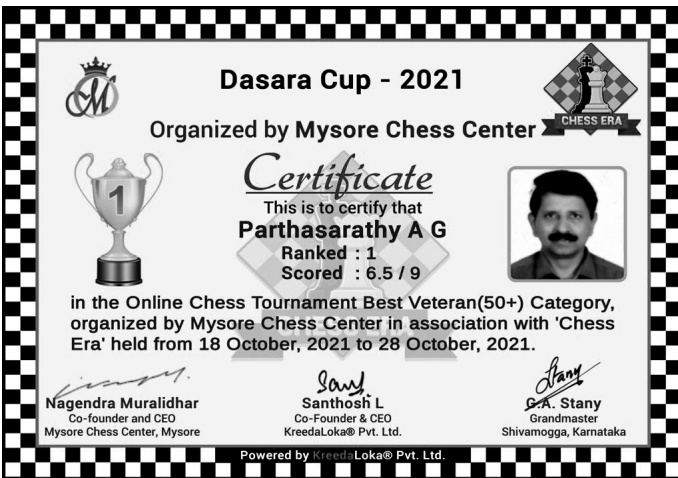
